Live & Learn is a non profit, non-government organisation that promotes greater understanding and action towards human and environmental sustainability through education and dialogue building.

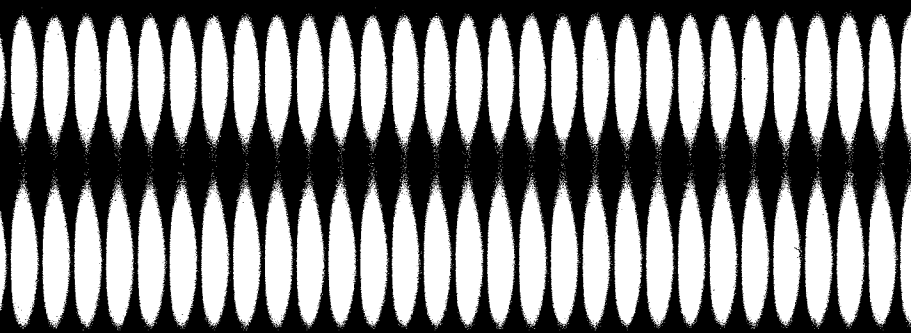

WASH

The project aims to improve access to sanitation for people of all ages, genders and special needs through the establishment of local sanitation enterprise groups. This process leads directly to improved community health and well-being, gender equity and provides an income stream. Sustainability is established through, education of appropriate sanitation options, skills in latrine construction techniques, and income generation using a demand driven approach.

RESOURCE CENTRE

The centre provides community access to environmental education resources and is a venue for workshops and training for schools and communities. The purpose is to increase public awareness on environmental issues and promote knowledge sharing.

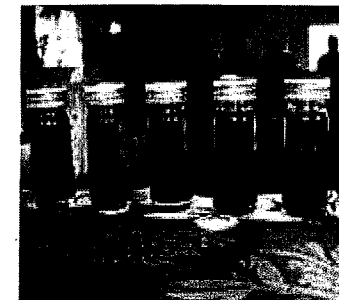

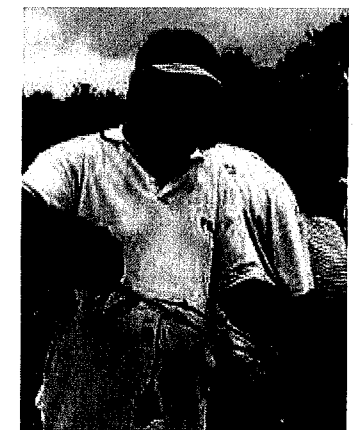
